

The 73rd Dubrovnik Summer Festival in numbers

17 event locations:

in front of the St Blaise's Church, Rector's Palace atrium, Sponza Palace Atrium, Lovrjenac Fort, in front of the St Jacob's Church, Jadran Open-air Cinema, Playground under Minčeta Fort, Bunić-Kaboga Summer Villa, Public Library Grad, St Mary's Convent Courtyard, Slavica Open-air Cinema, Sorkočević Summer Villa in Lapad, Lazareti, the Island of Lokrum, Pile, in front of the Cathedral



Drama:

The drama programme included 3 premieres:

- Lovers directed by Aleksandar Švabić and performed by the Festival Drama Ensemble in front of the St Jacob's Church (5 performances);
- The musical-theatre play The Enchanted Forest by director Lea Anastazija Fleger based on the eponymous Sunčana Škrinjarić novel, on the Lovrjenac Fort (5 performances);
- Blood Wedding, based on Federico García Lorca's text, directed by Franka Perković Gamulin performed by the Festival Drama Ensemble on the Island of Lokrum (6 performances).

Repeated were the performances of the following plays:

- William Shakespeare's *Hamlet* directed by **Paolo Magelli** and performed by the **Festival Drama Ensemble** on the Lovrjenac Fort (4 performances);
- Lion House by director Aida Bukvić based on the eponymous Ivan Salečić novel, performed by the Festival Drama Ensemble on the Playground under the Minčeta Fort (3 performances);
- Mara and Kata by Saša Božić, St Mary's Convent Courtyard (6 performances).

Guest performances on the drama programme were the following:

- Ladies' Park by Lero Student Theatre, written and directed by Davor Mojaš; Lazareti (2 performances);
- My Brilliant Friend based on the contemporary Italian author Elena Ferrante's novel of the same name and directed by Marina Pejnović, performed by the Croatian National Theatre Zagreb, Gradac Park (2 performances);
- Story of a Wheel (4 performances) and Princess and the Pea (4 performances) by the Mala scena theatre; Bunić-Kaboga Summer Villa

Thematic evenings:

- **Evening in Honor of Milan Milišić**, poetry evening; selection from Milan Milišić's works by Hrvoje Ivanković, Sorkočević Summer Villa in Lapad;
- **Liber Statutorum Civitatis Ragusii**, an evening dedicated to celebrating the 750th anniversary of the promulgation of the Dubrovnik Statute; Rector's Palace;
- **Evening dedicated to Ivica Kunčević**, a fitting programme in honour of the recently departed pioneer of site-specific theatre, director Ivica Kunčević; in Pile.

Tickets:

Purchases made with Mastercard® and Maestro® cards online or at the Box Office received a 10% discount, while the Festival ensured again instalment payment for purchases over HRK 500.00. Purchasing tickets for two premiere theatre or three music performances provided a complimentary ticket for one repeat theatre or music performance of choice while students were also eligible for a 10% discount for maximum of two tickets per performance with the Croatian Student Identity Card (X-ica) and International Student Identity Card (ISIC). The one-day DU Card granted, furthermore, a 10% discount for maximum two tickets per

performance, the three-day DU Card granted a 30% discount for maximum two tickets per

performance and the seven-day DU Card 50% discount for maximum two tickets per performance.
