

DUBROVAČKE LJETNE IGRE DUBROVNIK SUMMER FESTIVAL

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The 70th Dubrovnik Summer Festival in Numbers

Almost 2 000 artists from around 20 countries (USA, Russia, Sweden, China, Israel, Italy, Germany, Liechtenstein, Belgium, Austria, France, Serbia, Slovenia...).

20 venues: Rector's Palace atrium, Sponza Palace Atrium, in front of the St Blaise's Church, in front of the Cathedral, University of Dubrovnik Campus Park and Campus Hall, Bunić-Caboga Summer Villa, Jadran Open-air Cinema, Palace in Brothers Andrijić Street, Gradac Park, Art School Park, Lovrjenac Fort, Revelin Fort terrace, Bokar Fort, Foundry under Minčeta Fort, Lazareti, spaces of the Orlando Youth Association, Diocesan Seminary Garden in the Bošković Square, Former Radeljević Oil Factory, Festival Palace and Libertina café bar.

In total, **80 programmes** (including the grand opening) were realized, including:

30 theatre performances;
16 music performances;
2 dance/ballet performances;
5 folklore performances;
9 film screenings;
3 art exhibitions;
Along with 14 accompanying side events.

The audience development programme *City Keys* included **26** events altogether, with **11** events for children.

The 70th Festival offered **30 free performances**.

The performance of the **dance company Rosas** on the Revelin fort terrace was cancelled due to bad weather, as was **the dress rehearsal** for the grand opening ceremony.

Theatre:

The theatre programme of the 70th Festival included 3 premieres:

- William Shakespeare's *Hamlet* directed by **Paola Magelli** and performed by the **Festival Drama Ensemble** on the Lovrjenac Fort (7 performances);
- The musical theatre piece the *Little Prince* based on the eponymous Antoine de Saint-Exupéry classic as directed by Hrvoje Korbar and with music composed by Ivan Josip Skender in the Rector's Palace atrium (5 performances);
- Geranium by director Marina Pejnović, based on the eponymous short story written by Ivo Vojnović and Antun Šoljan's short story the Island as performed by the Festival Drama Ensemble in the Art School Park (6 performances).

Also on the programme were repeat performances of the following play:

• Ranko Marinković's Under the Balconies directed by Dario Harjaček with dramaturgy done by Vedrana Klepica and performed by the Festival Drama Ensemble in the University of Dubrovnik Campus Park (3 performances).

Guest performances on the theatre programme were the following:

- One Song A Day Takes Mischief Away by director Rene Medvešek, performed by the Croatian National Theatre of Zagreb ensemble, in the Gradac Park (2 performances);
- Dušan Kovačević's **Balkan Spy** as directed by **Tatjana Mandić Rigonat** and performed by the **Belgrade National Theatre**, in the Gradac Park (2 performances);
- **Drops** by Lero Students' Theatre, written and directed by **Davor Mojaš** (2 performances);
- **Diary of a Madman** directed by **Marjan Nećak** and performed by **Ozren Grabarić**, a mono-opera based on a N. V. Gogol short story, on the Bokar Fort (I performance);
- *Mistero buffo* based on the Dario Fo work and directed by Lee Delong, a monodrama performed by Dražen Šivak, on the Bokar Fort (1 performance);
- Room For A View, a monodrama based on Virginia Woolf's The New Dress directed by Marina Petković Liker and performed by Ivana Buljan Legati, on the Bokar Fort (1 performance).

Music:

A total of **16 music performances** were held, by orchestras (Lower Saxony State Orchestra from Hannover, Dubrovnik Symphony Orchestra, Croatian Radio and Television Symphony Orchestra), chamber ensembles (Zagreb Soloists, Esperanza Ensemble, Zagreb Quartet, Croatian Baroque Ensemble...), choirs (Ivan Goran Kovačić Academic Choir, Dubrovnik Chamber Choir, Libertas Mixed Choir, Croatian Radio and Television Choir) along with many soloists (Evelin Novak, Janja Vuletić, Tomislav Mužek, Krešimir Stražanac, Martina Filjak, Hakan Hardenberger, Ana Vidović, Yuja Wang, Andreas Ottensamer, Katarina Kutnar, Ivo Pogorelić, Luka Šulić, Aljoša Jurinić, Simone Rubino etc.) and maestros (Ivan Repušić, Franz Anton Krager, Enrico Dindo, Ivo Lipanović...), who presented their musical mastery across various styles and genres.

Dance/Ballet:

• Mariinsky Theatre, with the two-act ballet *The Four Seasons* choreographed by Ilya Zhivoi to the Max Richter recomposition of Vivaldi's piece, in the Gradac Park (2 performances).

Folklore:

- National Folk Dance Ensemble of Croatia LADO (I performance);

Tickets:

Ticket prices for the 70th Dubrovnik Summer Festival programmes and performances ranged from 80 to 600 kuna. The Dubrovnik Summer Festival once again ensured a 30% discount on tickets for all Festival programmes for residents of Dubrovnik and the Dubrovnik-neretva county, as well as affordable theatre and music programme package deals. A complimentary ticket for one repeat theatre or one music performance of choice was provided for the purchase of two theatre or three music performances. Students were eligible for a 30% discount with their student or ISIC cards.

Purchases with Mastercard® and Maestro® cards came with a 10% discount, while spending over 500 kuna with Mastercard® and Maestro® cards earned a 30% discount voucher for Festival souvenirs.

The Festival also ensured that payment in two to three instalments is available for purchases over 500 kuna made with Mastercard® and Maestro® cards.

Audiences:

The programmes of the anniversary 70th Dubrovnik Summer Festival were seen by some 60 000 people. From the programmes' announcement on 2 February until 24 August, the Festival's official website <u>www.dubrovnik-festival.hr</u> recorded nearly 200 000 visits, according to the recognised *Google Analytics* analysis, and 30 000 unique visitors from all over the world, of which 30% were from Croatia and 70% from the UK, USA, Germany, France, Italy, Spain, Australia,

Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Sweden, Serbia, Canada, and Austria. The audiences regularly followed the Dubrovnik Summer Festival on social networks – Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

Press:

Accreditations were provided for 195 media representatives, 117 of which were Croatian journalists, 67 Croatian photographers and cameramen while 11 journalists and photographers were foreign media representatives.

The Festival received considerable coverage in both local and foreign media with over 500 articles about the Festival printed in papers throughout July and August and over 3 500 published online, on websites and social networks. Media coverage of the Festival was substantial on national and local television stations also, with over 120 features dedicated to the Festival.
